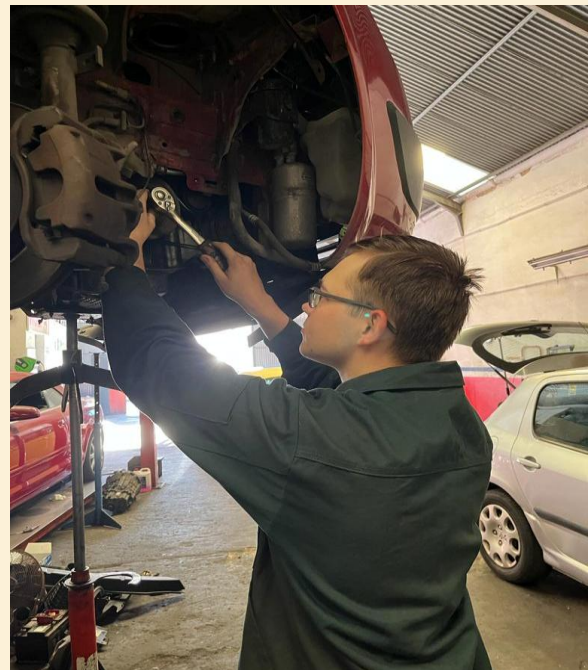
Here's what the students had to say about their experience in sunny Spain:
